III. COMMUNITY/GOVERNMENT REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS (3 minutes per speaker)

Senator Caroline Menjivar thanked all who collaborated in the celebration of CicLAvia. Canoga Park is unique as it has two state senators. Her office is located in Van Nuys and Tonya Ybarra and Kevin Taylor are available for assistance. Senator Menjivar updated the Council on the following:

- The emergency COVID allotment for increased Cal Fresh benefits will end this week and benefits will decrease significantly, her office is working to maintain those resources:
- 16 Bills have been introduced. Of concern is mental health, youth homelessness, housing, and the removal of asphalt from school grounds;
- A disaster preparedness program is available this Saturday, March 25th from 9:00 3:00 at Pierce College.

Treasurer Fuentes requested a resource to review the proposed 16 proposed Bills. Senator Menjivar shared a link to fact sheets at sd20.senate.ca.gov. There is also a monthly newsletter that provides recaps of proposed legislation.

Board member Patterson was recognized to speak and thanked Senator Menjivar for her community support and expressed concern about the Canoga Park District separation in certain areas. Senator Menjivar encouraged public input regarding district maps.

Board member Ayvazian stated her support of hybrid public hearings and supported Senator Menjivar to continue to support hybrid public hearings.

President Cole solicited public comment.

Chris Rowe was recognized to speak and requested jurisdiction boundaries. Ms. Menjivar stated that she has been appointed as an interim caretaker for districts that don't have a permanent Senator at this time.

Alberto Vargas, Field Representative at California State Assembly updated the Council on the following:

- AB591 provide universal chargers for electric vehicles in CA and supports environmentally friendly vehicles;
- AB1217 & AB61 will extend COVID assistance for small businesses;
- Pierce College will be providing an employment resource table on April 30th.

LAPD, Officer Moreno

Officer Moreno defined his jurisdiction and updated the Council on the following:

- Property crime is the biggest concern in Topanga and Canoga Park in the areas of mail thefts, burglaries and vehicle thefts;
- Aggravated assaults are a concern along with violent crimes;
- The Topanga Station is hosting a carnival May 18-21st with an open house in June.

Board member Ayvazian spoke on the opening of new apartment units and expressed concern on the additional public services that may be needed. Officer Moreno stated the staff is shorthanded and they are trying to maintain a continued level of service. Mayor Bass and LAFD are both recruiting additional staff.

a. Public Safety

Mirna Ezquivel, Economic Development Deputy, for Councilmember Bob Blumenfield's Office, updated the Council on the following:

- Councilmember Blumfield is keeping abreast on the LAUSD strike;
- June 24th is the Huntington Beach Los Angeles Public Library Safari Day, admission is free; however Canoga Park library is on hiatus due to new flooring installation;
- 44 unhoused individuals along the river have been housed, and efforts are underway to assist more individuals;
- March 25th is the opening of the new farmers market in the parking lot of River of the Valley Church.

b. Officers of Congress, Assembly, Mayor, City Council, County Supervisor, and School Board

Raul Preciado, DONE Representative, updated the Council on the following:

- Focus is being placed on the upcoming elections; deadline is April 4th for filing;
- Current Board members need to reapply;
- At this time, there are only 2 applications pending;
- Outreach needs to be increased for this last week for applicants for open positions as there is a mail-in application deadline;
- June 18th is election day:
- Return to in-person meetings is under discussion and our location needs to be determined. This may hinder the April in-person meeting.

Board member Clary clarified his status as an end-of-term appointed Board member with the DONE representative.

Board member Ayvazian verified that April's meeting is pending location vs Zoom approval. Mr. Preciado stated that the previous meeting site is being identified and paperwork pending completion.

Board members Clary and Paterson stated that they are available to assist in meeting paperwork and preparation.

Hector Ramirez was recognized to speak and asked about the application process. President Cole the next agenda item for discussion should address his concerns.

V. DEPARTMENT OF NEIGHBORHOOD EMPOWERMENT: EXHAUSTIVE EFFORTS-UPDATES

a. Exhaustive Efforts Work Plan-Updates

Raul Preciado stated that attaining a quorum is always a concern; however sometimes participation and interest is not sufficient to attain a quorum. Mr. Preciado provided a status update as two seats were filled at the previous February meeting; however, the roster and agenda have not been updated with the new additions. The Board retreat was this month and not all Board members attended and were trained. The absentees at the retreat will need to be rescheduled. The Bylaw Committee will meet after a new Board is seated, and changes to the Bylaws are not going to be made at this time. There has been progress in recruiting new board members.

Board member Ayvazian inquired about the Bylaws and the EE plan, what is necessary to get out of the EE phase? Mr. Preciado stated that the requirement of attaining a quorum cannot be changed at this time, we can fill seats and recruit. Mr. Preciado also acknowledged the absenteeism rate.

Board member Clary stated that the sudden onset of quorum problem manifested itself post COVID, and should we do a Bylaws change as soon as we have the authority to make modifications. Attendance is very important.

Mr. Preciado stated that the process to change the quorum is the authority of the body and DONE is not demanding that this be done.

Board member Ho expressed concern regarding consistent and repeated absences, could these absent individuals be released from their appointment, what is that action? - N. Topographic Map: If slopes over 10% exist. If site is over 50 acres, 1" = 200' scale is acceptable.
- O. <u>Cultural/Historic Impact Report</u>: If the project involves a designated Cultural/Historic property <u>or</u> a historic/cultural resource deemed eligible as historic resources through SurveyLA.
- P. <u>Cultural/Historic Assessment</u>: If the project involves an undesignated structure, 45 years or older, provide clear unobstructed color photographs of <u>all building facades</u>, including accessory structures and a copy of the original (oldest) building permit, with plan sketch, if available.
- Q. <u>Traffic Assessment</u>: If the project approaches or exceeds the following thresholds a Traffic Assessment review by the Department of Transportation (DOT) may be required (this list is not exhaustive, and unlisted uses may also require assessment).

The name of this corporation shall be VALLEY CULTURAL CENTER - WARNER PARK CORPORATION.

II

The purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

- (a) The specific and primary purposes are:
- 1. To assist the City of Los Angeles through its Department of Recreation and Parks in the development of the Warner Park including the erection and dedication of public buildings and facilities for the benefit of the community.
- 2. The name of this corporation is the Valley Cultural Center - Warner Park Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation".

ARTICLE II: Principal Office

The principal office of the Corporation shall be located in the City of Los Angeles, State of California.

ARTICLE III: Organization

No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for political office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI: Membership

- A. Class. There shall be only one class of membership. The initial members shall be the persons named in the Articles of Incorporation as the first Directors of the Corporation.
- B. Admissions. The members may admit new members or fill vacancies, except that there shall be no discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- C. Terminations. Subject to the transfer provisions below, membership of any member shall terminate upon the resignation or death of the member. Failure to pay prescribed dues or any fees held to be a qualification for membership may be considered as an offer of resignation if the delinquency exceeds three months. Any member may be terminated for cause by a vote of the majority of all the members exclusive of such a member.
- D. Transfer. No membership, or any right arising therefrom, shall be transferable; provided, however, that any or all memberships and any or all rights arising therefrom, including voting rights, may be transferred to a director in connection with the issuance of bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation, to provide additional protection for the holder or holders of such indebtedness, and in such event such director may exercise all rights pertaining to such memberships or all rights so transferred, as the case may be. So long as any memberships or any rights arising therefrom are held by any such director such memberships and rights shall not be terminated, notwithstanding the death or resignation of any transferring member or members, unless and until termination thereof is approved in writing by such director.
- any right or any interest in any asset of the Corporation. Each member is entitled to one vote and may so act either in person or by proxy.
- F. Dues and Assessments. Dues and assessments, if any, shall be determined by the directors and approved by a majority of the members.

ARTICLE VII: Meetings

- A. Annual Meeting. A meeting of the members for the election of directors and for the transaction of such business as may come before the meeting shall be held on the first Thursday of November of each year at such hour and place as fixed by the directors.
- B. Special Meetings. The President, any two directors, or a majority of the members may call a special meeting for any purpose at any time.
- C. Notices. Notice of each meeting of members, whether regular or special, shall specify date, place, and hour of meeting and be given to each member at least 24 hours before the date of the meeting by mail. Notice of a special meeting shall set forth the purpose of the meeting.

- D. Quorum and Manner of Action. Five members, or a majority of the members, if that be less, shall constitute a quorum for all regular or special meetings, except as otherwise specified by these Bylaws. The transactions of any meeting of members, however called or noticed and wherever held, shall be valid if each member not present signs a waiver of notice or a consent to holding such a meeting or an approval of the minutes thereof. Any action which may be taken as specified by these Bylaws may also be taken without a meeting if authorized in writing by all members and filed with the Secretary.
- Newly Revised shall govern the proceedings of this Corporation in all cases not provided for in these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII: Directors

- A. Number, Term. The Board of Directors shall consist of eight persons. The number of directors may be changed by amending this Bylaw, provided the number shall not be less than three. The directors named in the Articles of Incorporation shall hold office until the first regular meeting of the members and thereafter until the election and qualification of their successors. Directors elected shall hold office until election and qualification of their successors or until death, resignation, or removal.
- B. Organization. The first Board may at any time and each succeeding Board shall, within seven days after being elected, hold an organization meeting in which it shall elect from its numbers a President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by one person. The Board may also elect subordinate officers, none of whom need be a member of the Board or a member of the Corporation. Each officer shall hold office until the election and qualification of his successor or until his death, resignation, or removal.
- C. Meetings. The Board shall designate the place and time of Board meetings. If regular meetings are fixed for place and time, notice need not be given. Special meetings may be called by the President, Vice President, or any two directors. Notice of a special meeting shall be delivered personally or mailed to each director at least one day before the meeting.
- D. Manner of Action. The transactions of any Board meeting, however called and noticed, shall be valid if a quorum be present and if each director either before or after the meeting signs a waiver or consent to holding such a meeting or approval of the minutes thereof. Any action permitted to the Board may be taken without a meeting if all directors, either individually or collectively, file written consents to the action with the corporate secretary.
- E. Quorum. A majority of directors present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum unless a greater number is required by these Bylaws or by statute. The President or, in his absence, the Vice President, or in the absence of the Vice President, a chairman chosen by the majority of directors present, shall preside.
- F. Vacancies. A vacancy shall be deemed to exist in event of the death, resignation, or removal of a director or the failure of the members to elect the full number of directors. A vacancy may be filled by the remaining director even though less than a quorum. A director so elected shall hold office until his successor is elected at a regular meeting of the members or a

special meeting called for such purpose. Members may elect directors to fill vacancies not filled by the Board if such action is taken in a special meeting noticed and held for such purpose. Any director may be removed from office by the vote of a majority of the members.

G. Compensation. No director shall be entitled to compensation for serving as an officer or director of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IX: Powers of the Board of Directors

- A. General. Subject to the provisions of these Bylaws, the Board shall control all corporate powers and the business, property, and affairs of the Corporation. No director shall be responsible for an error in judgment or for what he may do or refrain from doing when acting in good faith.
- B. Indebtedness. The Board on behalf of the Corporation may incur such indebtedness for the proper purposes of the Corporation as the Board deems necessary or appropriate, may issue bonds, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation, may secure the same by mortgage, transfer in trust, encumbrance of the whole or any part of the assets of the Corporation, may acquire property subject to deeds of trust, mortgages or other liens or encumbrances, and may establish funds and make other provisions for the payment of such indebtedness and interest thereon.

ARTICLE X: Officers

- A. Identity. The officers shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer or a Secretary-Treasurer, and such subordinate officers as the Board of Directors may designate. Only directors shall be qualified to hold principal offices, but the Board may appoint any person, whether a director or not, to hold any subordinate office.
- B. Election, Term. Each officer shall be elected by the Board of Directors, and shall hold office until his successor is elected and qualified, or until his death, resignation, or removal.
- C. Resignations, Removals. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President or Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, and unless specified therein the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. A vacancy in any office shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these Bylaws for appointment or election to such office.
- D. President. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation, and shall have general supervision over the business of the Corporation, subject to the control of the Board of Directors. He shall preside at all meetings of the Corporation the Board. He may sign and execute in the name of the Corporation the deeds, deeds of trust, mortgages, leases, bonds, contracts, and other instruments authorized by the Board and generally perform duties assigned to him by the Board.

- E. <u>Vice President</u>. At the request of the President, or in case of his absence or disability, the Vice President shall perform all duties of the President. When so acting, he shall have all the powers of and be subject to the restrictions upon the President. Also, the Vice President shall perform such duties as may be assigned to him by the President or the Board of Directors.
- F. Secretary. The Secretary shall: (a) Certify and keep at the office of the Corporation or at such other place the Board of Directors may decide, the original copy of the Bylaws, as amended or otherwise altered; (b) keep at the office, or such other place as the Board shall decide, the minutes of all meetings of the members or Board, recording therein the time and place of the holding, whether regular or special and if special how authorized, the notice thereof given, and the proceedings thereat; (c) see that all notices are given according to these Bylaws or as required by law; (d) be custodian of the records and seal of the Corporation; (e) keep at the office a membership book of the names and addresses of members and, in a case where a membership has been terminated, record such fact and date of such termination; (f) exhibit at all times which are reasonable, to any member, the Bylaws, membership book, and the minutes and proceedings of meetings of the members or Board; perform such duties as may be assigned by the Board or the President.
- G. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall (a) be overseer of all funds belonging to the Corporation and deposit them properly in a bank designated by the Board of Directors; (b) pay all bills by check upon authorization of Board of Directors; all checks shall be signed by two of the four named officers--Treasurer, President, Vice President, or Secretary; (c) keep an accurate account of all financial transactions and submit the books for an annual audit; (d) submit a report at the meetings of the Board of Directors; perform all duties as may be assigned by the President.

ARTICLE XI: Dissolution

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the Corporation, turn over all assets of the Corporation to the City of Los Angeles with the recommendation that such assets be used for the purposes for which the Corporation was formed.

ARTICLE XII: Fiscal Year

The Fiscal Year of the Corporation shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31, except the first Fiscal Year shall run from the date of incorporation to December 31.

ARTICLE XIII: Amendment

Any of these Bylaws may be amended or repealed, and new Bylaws may be adopted, by vote or written consent of a majority of the members except that without prior approval by the Internal of the United States of America, Article III, Article IV, Article V, Article VIII G., Article XI, and Article XIII shall not be amended
