The Canoga Park Neighborhood Council supports the ED 1 Ordinance (CF 23-0623) if amended to include the guidelines sent by United Neighbors to the PLUM committee, with a particular focus on the importance of the following amendments:

- 1) Limit the number of waivers and off menu incentives to a total of 6:
- 2) Require rear 15' setbacks to allow for trees to grow and storm water to be captured;
- 3) Prevent post-development conversion of nonresidential spaces to market rate units:
- 4) Protect R 1, HPOZs and Historic Districts in their entirety;
- 5) Ensure that substandard streets/ high-fire zones do not qualify for ED 1 fast track approval;
- 6) Require ED 1 projects meet minimum Tier 2 TOC qualifications.

Projects that don't meet these requirements under ED 1 would need to go through discretionary approval
